

Arts and Sciences Committee on Curriculum and Instruction (ASC CCI)

Report for the ASC Faculty Senate 2010 – 2011

For activities from April 27, 2010 through August 23, 2011

A. Curricular and Assessment Initiatives

Calendar Conversion and Implementation

- CCI discussed and voted on faculty rules governing undergraduate degrees in Arts and Sciences under semesters: general college/degree rules, rules governing majors, rules governing minors.
- CCI continued to define, refine, and voted on the goals and expected learning outcomes of the three new General Education topics under semesters: Education Abroad, Service Learning, and Cross-disciplinary Seminars (Capstone: Issues of the Contemporary World successors and new).
- On February 11, 2011, CCI voted unanimously to maintain the GE Natural Sciences BA/BS designation under semesters.
- CCI approved the exact language of the GE topics and the order of the topics.
- On February 25, 2011, CCI voted unanimously to approve the new semester version of minimum and maximum hour requirements for students who are completing the BFA and BAE dual degrees and the BM and BME dual degrees.
- On March 11, CCI endorsed ULAC's recommendation that the following numbers be adopted for Cross-disciplinary seminars under semesters:
 - 3597 or 4597: for straight conversions of old capstone issues of the contemporary world and possible future capstone issues of the contemporary world.
 - New cross-disciplinary seminars: x596 (2000 level or above).

- CCI was briefed about the proposed thesis option regulations.
- A separate report on Freshman Seminars and Professional Pathways will be submitted.

B. Quarter Majors and Minors

New Quarter Majors Approved by ASC CCI:

Sexuality Studies BA

The new B.A., devoted to the interdisciplinary analysis of human sexuality, has evolved out of the highly successful minor in Sexuality Studies launched at Ohio State in 2002. The new major incorporates ASC and non-ASC course work, and makes Ohio State one of the first universities to offer a truly interdisciplinary major in Sexuality Studies. The new degree prepares undergraduates for careers in fields related to public policy, sexual health, social work, and for graduate school in the humanities,

social sciences, and education. An initial full-time enrollment of 5 students is expected in the first year, with growth to a total of 25 admissions by the fourth year. The major is described of three parts: 10 credit hours of Core Cluster courses, 15 credit hours of Focus Area courses, and 25 credit hours of Sexuality electives. Student expected learning outcomes and an assessment plan have been developed for this major.

Major Quarter Revisions Approved by CCI

SBS Aviation Transportation Major

The revised major proposes to remedy a situation whereby due to curricular changes over the last few years the SBS Aviation Transportation major has taken an increasingly vocational aspect. In its current format, it is possible for SBS students to earn the degree without taking SBS courses. Indeed, the current major is comprised of Aviation core courses, Aviation electives, and Aviation management courses. In contrast, the revised SBS major will include an Aviation core and Aviation electives as well as an SBS core of six Geography courses and three SBS elective courses. The major will be housed in the Department of Geography. Whereas the current major requires 52-56 quarter hours, the revised major will require 96 hours. Student enrollment is expected to remain steady at approximately 150 students. The revised major will provide excellent preparation for jobs in fields like airline/airport management, air traffic control, marketing, travel logistics, and public relations. The program has student expected learning outcomes in place and plans to monitor student progress via direct and indirect assessment methods.

Communication Major—Technology Track

The revision is intended to give students in Communication Technology a more coherent course of study and a clearer understanding of the career choices available to them. Indeed, assessment data revealed that students in the previous Communication Technology focus area lacked a clear sense of how the courses they were taking related and how these added up to the acquisition of a set of skills. As part of the revision, one new course has been developed and three courses have been revised, all reflecting developments in communications technologies. Also, the revised Communication Technology focus area is now subdivided into two tracks: Human-Computer Interaction (HCI) and Communication Technology Management (CTM). Credit hours for the major remain essentially unchanged: 62-65 (15 for the premajor and 47-50 for the actual major, depending on which courses are selected). As far as assessment is concerned, indirect measures are used (student exit survey of graduating seniors and alumni survey) and direct measures are considered as well. As a result of the proposed revision, an increase of 10% in student enrollment is expected—before the revision, approximately 90 students were enrolled in the Communication Technology focus area.

Bachelor of Music in Composition

The changes are made in response to the perceived lack of composition experiences for majors in the BM in Composition identified by the National Association of Schools of Music (NASM) in its most recent accreditation report. The credit hours for the total major of 182 remain unchanged. The School of Music moved the Composer's Seminar courses into the Music Theory and Composition area, deleting 3 credit hours from the Ensembles side of the advising sheet and placing them on the Music Theory and Composition side of the advising sheet. They also took the 10 credit hours that were open music electives for their composition students and placed them in the Music Theory and Composition area to

include courses in Composition 2 for 6 credits and one additional Senior Composition Project experience of 4 credits. The rearrangement of the 13 credit hours will allow the School of Music to be in compliance with the NASM standards.

Bachelor of Arts in Music

The changes are made in response to the lack of performance/applied study opportunities within the BA in Music identified by the National Association of Schools of Music (NASM) in its most recent accreditation report. The credit hours for the total major of 181 remain unchanged. The School of Music added to its current 6 credit hours in applied study, 6 hours taken from the open electives category and moved 3 credit hours from the music theory category into the applied study at the 201 level (6 credits) and at the 401 level (6 credits). This is a change from 67 credit hours in the major under quarters to 73 credit hours in the major still under quarters. The addition of the 6 credit hours will allow the School of Music to be in compliance with the NASM standards throughout the rest of our quarter offerings of the program.

C. Semester Majors and Minors

New Semester Majors

Arts Management - Bachelor of Arts in Arts Management

The new major is an outgrowth of the minor in Arts Entrepreneurship and is created in response to the growing field of arts management. The 36-credit hour major is drawn from existing courses to complete credit hours in the Department of Art Education and in the Fisher College of Business. The major is designed for students planning a career in arts and cultural institutions, arts councils and agencies, or in for-profit arts organizations. The Department anticipates initial cohorts of twenty-five students. Student expected learning outcomes and an assessment plan have been submitted for the new major.

Religious Studies BA

The BA in Religious Studies is a reactivation of the BA in Religious Studies from 1984, which was deactivated in 1998 and replaced with the BA in Comparative Studies with a Specialization in Religious Studies in 1998. The 1998 version of the BA in Religious Studies was 65 quarter-credit hours; the 2012 version of the BA in Religious Studies with two transcriptable subplans will be 36—the same as the other programs within the Department of Comparative Studies. The BA in Religious Studies with a Subplan of Study of Religions has four core courses, 12 credit hours; and 24 credits of electives are selected from a Cross-Cultural Distribution and an Interdisciplinary Distribution. The BA in Religious Studies with a Subplan of Religions and Cultures has two foundation courses, 6 credit hours; two required courses, 6

credit hours; and the remaining credit hours fulfilled by courses that are selected from a list of elective courses that complete the distribution requirement of three specific religious traditions. The BA has student expected learning outcomes and an assessment plan using both direct and indirect measures.

Romance Studies BA

The BA in Romance Studies will be a total of 38 hours in the major with another 6 credits of prescribed GE credit of Education Abroad. The 38-credit hour major is drawn from existing courses to complete credit hours in multiple units: Department of Greek and Latin, Department of Spanish and Portuguese, Department of French and Italian (the administrative home), and the Department of Slavic and Eastern European Languages and Literatures. The major program is a highly rigorous one and requires the following experiences: one core course 5051 (cross-listed in Italian, French, Spanish and Classics) that provides students with the opportunity to examine how the Romance Languages are related and at the same time how they are different; a primary language; a secondary language; and a Tertiary Field. The new BA has student expected learning outcomes and an assessment plan using both direct and indirect measures. Since this is a “niche” program, the numbers are not expected to be high, but it is anticipated that in the first few years up to five students will select the major/year. As students become aware of and more familiar with the program, we can expect up to 8-10 students to join the major/year.

ASC & COM/Neuroscience BS

This is an interdisciplinary program drawing faculty from Arts and Sciences and Medicine. The new major will draw upon expertise from the Departments of Psychology, Oral Biology, EEOB, Neuroscience, and affiliated Neuroscience Signature programs in the College of Medicine. Oversight of the major will fall to the Dean of Social and Behavioral Sciences and will be administratively housed within Psychology. All of Ohio State’s aspirational peers and all other Big Ten schools have undergraduate degrees in Neuroscience (including Neurobiology and Behavioral Neuroscience). The Neuroscience minor has grown steadily since its initial offering in 2005, and the major is expected to draw 35-60 new students each year for the first four years and to exceed 100 within the first 2-3 years. The major will consist of 12 hours of core prerequisites, 15 hours of core courses, and 21 hours of three possible specializations (or tracks): Molecular/Cellular; Systems/ Behavioral; and Cognitive/Computational (further prerequisite courses may be required depending on the specialization courses chosen). The new BS has student expected learning outcomes and an assessment plan using both direct and indirect measures.
