

Arts and Sciences Curriculum Committee (ASCC)

Report for the ASC Faculty Senate

For activities from July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023

A. Curricular Initiatives

General Education Bookend: Reflection Seminar

On March 3rd, 2023, Dean Meg Daly (Associate Dean for Undergraduate Education) and Ms. Sarah Holt (Sr. Instructional Designer—ODEE) presented the Carmen shell for the 2nd bookend course. The full ASCC was chosen to review this course since it does not fall under the purview of any ASCC Panel or other University governing body. The ASCC asked some clarifying questions of the presenters, and then tabled the discussion of this course until the next meeting.

On March 24th, the committee discussed the course further, bringing up the following concerns:

1. The 1 credit hour course seemed to focus on the curation of a portfolio, which caused concern regarding the course's workload, and the amount of time that students would spend creating the portfolio versus reflecting on the GEN experience.
2. The software that the course revolves around, PebblePad, has some issues with accessibility. These are usually connected to the artifacts that students upload, but the committee was concerned that this could be a stumbling block moving forward.
3. The curation process depends on students accumulating artifacts during their undergraduate experience. They would like the GEN Bookends' faculty/staff/instructors to emphasize this in the Launch Seminar, so that students understand that they should preserve these artifacts throughout their time at the university.
4. Some members expressed concern that this focused too much on academic experiences when students may be focused on other things as they move toward graduation, but other committee members felt this was not a problem, as the stated goals for the course were a reflection on academic experiences and the General Education specifically.

After the robust and rigorous discussion on March 24th, the Committee held an e-vote to determine the feedback they wished to provide to the Bookend team. Ultimately, the proposal was approved with two contingencies, one comment, and three recommendations. The contingencies have since been satisfied and the course is now fully approved.

Syllabus Statements

On September 23rd, 2022, the committee approved updates to their required/recommended syllabus statements pertaining to disability services (which is a required element for all ASC syllabi) and mental health (which is a recommended element for all ASC syllabi). The Committee also considered a new Title IX statement (recommended element), but ultimately decided that the new statement was too broad and chose to continue to recommend the old language.

World Language Placement Testing

On Oct. 10th, 2022, the committee approved an update to the world language placement testing policy. Prior to the proposed change, OSU policy allowed incoming students to take a placement test and receive up to 12 EM (credit by examination) credit hours toward their degree. The new policy uses the test scores only to place students into classes commensurate with their abilities (1101, 1102, 1103, and, in some cases, beyond) but does not award credit for courses that the student may have scored high enough to bypass. This change brings language placement testing in-line with other units' placement

testing, such as the Department of Mathematics, and also aligns OSU rules with the policies of our peer institutions in the Big Ten. Additionally, it is more equitable, because under the previous policy, international students and native/heritage speakers of languages that are not taught at Ohio State were not able to earn credit when they demonstrated proficiency.

General Education Approval Process for Transfer Students

On December 2nd, 2022, the committee discussed the possible formation of a university-level committee run through the Office of Undergraduate Education to evaluate transfer credit for the General Education. Currently, decisions about this are made by individual colleges, who do not always agree with one another, and this system creates issues when students change majors. In our college, this work is done by a group of veteran academic advisors, as some years ago the number and complexity of the requests became so burdensome that the faculty who considered them felt that academic advisors would be better equipped to handle it. The adoption of this new system would allow for consistency between colleges and put these decisions back in the hands of university faculty.

Syllabus Format

On Oct. 21st, 2022, the committee discussed the merits of standardized syllabi; this conversation was prompted by a syllabus that had recently been reviewed by the SBS Panel. The syllabus had an unusual layout and bold graphic elements that were visually arresting, but the Panel had a difficult time locating the information they needed to evaluate the course. Additionally, they were concerned that the use of colors, varying fonts and font sizes and unusual layout might not be in line with accessibility requirements. Committee members expressed frustration at what some feel to be the “dual purpose” of syllabi in the current educational environment, lamenting that syllabi have evolved into pseudo-legal documents with all kinds of required statements that make them unwieldy and overshadow the information that is pertinent to the course. A number of solutions were suggested and brought up, including multiple syllabi for the same course (so that one was simpler, more accessible, and more printer-friendly), the elimination of “boilerplate” syllabus elements and the possibility of migrating those to Carmen, and the discussion of syllabi being “replaced” by Carmen pages. On Dec. 16th, 2022 this conversation continued with a suggestion from one committee member that boilerplate syllabus statements be combined in one central “repository” that could be linked to syllabi rather than including full statements. Dean Bernadette Vankeerbergen (Arts and Sciences Assistant Dean for Curriculum and Assessment) commented that this would likely have to be taken on at the university level rather than at the college level.

Certificate Credit Overlap

On Jan. 20th, 2023, Dean Andrew Martin (Arts and Sciences Associate Dean for Undergraduate Education) informed the committee that the university was considering a change in policy that would allow departments to offer certificates that could overlap 100% with other degree requirements (majors, minors, general education, etc.). [Note: At the time of this discussion, only 50% of the courses in a certificate could overlap with other requirements.] There were questions from the committee about how this would and/or could be applied retroactively for students who had already graduated and returned to the university, and how this differed from specializations or tracks within majors for certificates that could be “housed” entirely within one major.

On April 21st, 2023, Dean Martin shared with the committee that this proposal for the possibility of 100% overlap had passed CAA, and that there would now be a formal process by which units could ask for their certificates to be altered to all for 100% overlap. He emphasized that certificates will not

automatically allow for this, but that it would be a departmental decision for the unit offering the certificate.

Proposal to Rename Interdisciplinary Team-Teaching High Impact Practice in New General Education and Update Submission Form

On Feb. 17th, 2022, the Committee voted to endorse a name change and a new form for this GEN Themes HIP category. The new name of the category will be “Interdisciplinary and Integrated Collaborative Teaching”. The new name and form were developed as a result of the set of criteria that the Themes Panels look for when evaluating course proposals, and these criteria evolved organically from the conversations that the Panels have been having. The original HIP forms are not helpful in evaluating courses, as they do not ask faculty to answer questions regarding how or why their course fits into a given HIP category, but rather are focused on pedagogical best practices. Additionally, the Panels felt that the name of the category was misleading, as the term “team-teaching” has a multitude of definitions that are discipline dependent. The Panels have encountered resistance to their feedback, as faculty are submitting courses that meet their definition of “team-teaching”, even though the courses do not meet the appropriate goals of HIP courses. The Themes Panel will likely work to develop similar forms for other HIP categories in the future.

Podium Pilot Program

On April 21st, 2023, Dean Martin informed the committee that the college and the Office of International Affairs would be running a pilot program in SU23 or AU23 with a company called Podium that operates online programs that combine internships with international companies and education abroad-style learning experiences. This program will be at an extra cost to students. The committee was supportive but expressed concern that this would be marketed as an Education Abroad experience and encouraged the college to refrain from referring to these as “Education Abroad” or “Study Abroad” programs.

Direct Instruction in Asynchronous Courses

On April 7th, 2023, the committee engaged in a discussion of how to identify activities that constitute direct instruction in online, asynchronous courses. Ms. Elizabeth Vu (Director of Distance Education) and Mr. Jeremie Smith (Distance Education Coordinator) from the Arts and Sciences Office of Distance Education were invited guests. Ms. Vu shared some history on the terminology of direct and indirect instruction, and its linkage to in-person instruction and accreditation. She believes that a national discussion of this issue is on the horizon. The student members of the committee acknowledged that their engagement with courses and instructors in an online environment varied greatly, especially if that engagement was optional. Mr. Smith volunteered to create a webpage that helps to define the terms of direct instruction more clearly. While this would be intended for and most helpful to faculty developing an online asynchronous course for the first time, it might also be a helpful resource for Committee members.

Election of a New Chair

On May 5th, 2023, Dr. Jennifer Ottesen (Associate Professor, Department of Chemistry and Biochemistry) was nominated to serve as the new Chair of the ASCC. She was unanimously elected to the position.
